



The Battle of Plattsburgh Commemoration

The American victory over the British on September 11, 1814, was celebrated by citizens in Plattsburgh within weeks after the battle and commemorations have continued for more than 200 years. In 1998 a small group of volunteers led by Christopher "Kit" Booth, organized a commemorative event which has evolved into the Annual Battle of Plattsburgh Commemoration that we enjoy today.

In 2020, 1814 Commemoration Inc., an all volunteer organization was formed and tasked with presenting the annual event and has done so each year since. After a highly successful 25th Anniversary commemoration in 2023, volunteers are once again working behind the scene to bring together historic reenactors and demonstrators, planning ceremonies and events, lining up entertainment groups and laying out a wide range of activities for our 2024 annual event.

September 11, 1814 The Battle of Plattsurgh

Review of recorded dates when citizens in the City of Plattsurgh commemorated this historic event



September 23 Citizens of Plattsburgh invited Captain Thomas Macdonough, General Alexander Macomb, General Benjamin Mooers and officers to a public dinner to honor them and to celebrate their victory.

September 11 An address by Amasa C. Moore, on the Battle of Plattsurgh, was delivered at a celebration of the anniversary of the Battle.

"In the history of communities, as well as of individuals, there is usually some particular event, or period, which colors their career and is justly regarded as the most important and decisive of any portion of their existence. Such an Era is the 11th of September 1814 - the day which, alies the lapse of almost thirty years, is indelibly impressed on the memory of all what were then on the stage of existence, and the generation which has since arisen, has been taught to regard with the deepest interest. A day not only deeply affecting this community ut also the great and glorious republic to which we belong."

September 11 Plattsurgh Centenary Celebration of the Battle of Plattsburgh. A celebration in the City of Plattsurgh, of the victory which decided the War of 1812.

1926 August 18 Dedication of the Thomas Macdonough Memorial Monument. Seven thousand citizens gathered by the monument across from City Hall for the ceremony.

Septemer 11 "Battle of Plattsurg Day" proclaimed by Mayor John A. Tyrell. A ceremony and the unveiling of a bronze plaque took place at the Samuel de Champlain Monument designating Plattsurgh Bay a National Historic landmark.

1964 July 3 - 11 Sesquicentennial Battle of Plattsurgh Commemoration. Organized by over 1000 volunteers. It included a play with a cast of hundreds, an outdoor Ball with musician Louis Armstrong and his band and eleven days of continuous activities and pageantry.

1998 - 2013 Annual Battle of Plattsurgh Commemoration. Organized by volunteers.

2014 August 20 - September 11 Bicentennial of the Battle of Plattsurgh. A seventeen-day spectacular event organized by hundreds of volunteers and attended by thousands of citizens.

2015 - 2019 Annual Battle of Plattsurgh Commemoration organized by the City of Plattsurg with the help of local volunteers.

August 23 - September 13 Battle of Plattsurgh "Virtual" Commemoration Formation of 1814 Commemoration Inc., a 501(c)3 non profit, a volunteer organization. (website 1814inc.com) A restricted event due to pandemic.

September 9 - 12 Annual Battle of Plattsurgh Commemoration Organized by 1814 Commemoration Inc. Partially restricted due to pandemic.

September 9 - 11 Annual Battle of Plattsurgh Commemoration

September 7 - 11 25th Anniversary of Continuous Battle of Plattsurgh Commemorations.

September 13 - 15 Annual Battle of Plattsurgh Commemoration - 26 years and counting.
