Welcome

The City may pay for the band on the steps of City Hall on Friday night.

<u>Tim Horn</u> is making the contacts with military bands.

Navy Band: they would like to work in the schools if they come. They may have a conflict as there may be a ship christening that they must participate in during the BOP Commemoration, but they would still be able to send the pop group.

10th Mountain Division, 42and Division from Vermont: Tim Horn reported that it is against regs to have 2 military bands perform at the same event but if we pay for one, that might work. Vicki Giroux said in the past we had paid for a bus and meal for one band.

Norwich: Tim Horn has been trying to contact. Vicki Giroux offered to help if Tim cannot get through to them.

<u>Vicki Giroux</u> is arranging for the marching bands for the parade.

Tom Donahue mentioned that Jerrod had mentioned a possible fundraiser at the Strand.

History Education now called History and Art

Chris Ransom summarized Linda's report. Linda MastersonWard is working on history education. Linda is now calling the Education program History and Art. 2,000 of the coloring books were printed and will be distributed to the schools and the balance divided between 1814 inc. and CCHA. She has invited schools to participate in a Living History event like the event we provided to Morrisonville School in 2023, maybe in May or June!

Linda has invited the Chateau Ramezay Museum people and is waiting for their confirmation. Linda invited Bill Pomeroy to the Commemoration. Linda recommends that we invite him to give a talk and host him in a nice hotel.
